**Community Climate Collaborative
Paid Teen Internships**

The Community Climate Collaborative (C3) is seeking high schoolers for a Summer 2024 paid internship to begin on June 17th and end on August 9th. Rising 10th - 12th graders are encouraged to apply.

At C3, we believe that everyone has a role to play when it comes to confronting climate change. C3 catalyzes climate action through collaboration, programs, and advocacy. We work closely with schools, businesses, households, and local governments to implement carbon emissions reductions, develop climate action plans, and enact equitable policies that accelerate climate action and build climate leaders. We use a positive, solutions-oriented approach and strive to be a model for other cities and counties throughout the Commonwealth.

Many youth are often left out of conversations about climate change and the impact it will have on their families and their futures. Older students need content to help them understand climate change and its potential impacts on their lives and neighborhoods. To address this, we have developed climate and energy content for older students with an interest in climate change. We can help translate the overwhelming problem of climate change into measurable, tangible concepts around climate and energy, allowing youth to identify and understand solutions.

Teen Internship

C3 is looking for students who want to take part in learning the workings of a local climate nonprofit. The intern will learn and complete activities in the following areas: Development, Communications, Policy, and Corporate Sustainability. The interns will:

- Be empowered to identify skills they can use to take action on climate.
- Practice filming and editing video footage to tell a compelling story.
- Participate in a joint project with Light House Studio to produce a documentary about policy research underway at C3.
- Learn about non-profit communications and design.
- Contribute to the creation of a teen guide about everyday actions that make a climate impact.
